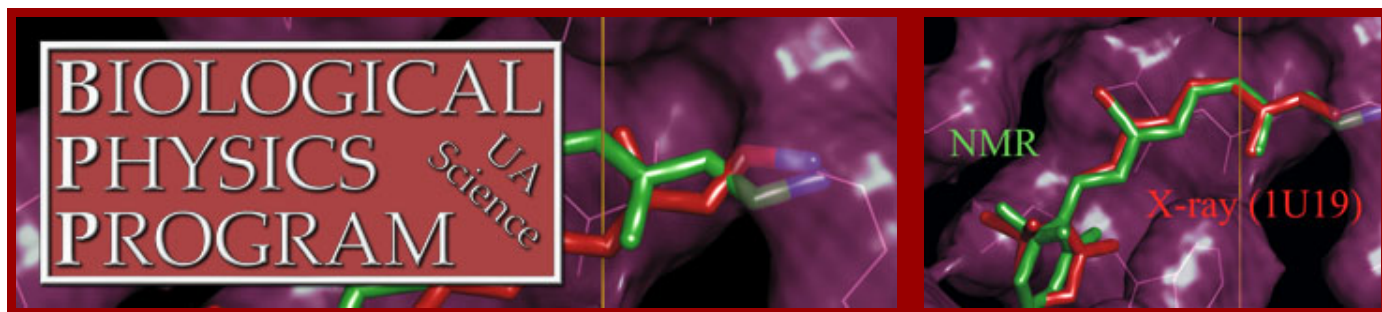


Prospective BPP Students
