

Master's Degrees in Chemistry

A limited number of students are accepted to pursue Master's degrees in Chemistry. Typically, no financial support is provided for pursuit of these degrees. Please contact the [Graduate Coordinator](#) ^[1] if you plan to apply for these programs.

Master of Science:

The MS degree is a research degree requiring a written thesis. All students must pass a final oral examination.

Master of Arts:

Students who plan to teach chemistry in secondary schools will find this program adapted to their needs. The M.A. degree is a non-thesis degree that is awarded for advanced study in chemistry beyond the bachelor's degree.
